EMOTIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES


Because the grieving process does not necessarily begin at the moment of your loved one's death, a trained support staff will contact you twice. Once after three months and a second time after 6 months have passed. We offer families two free consultations with our bereavement support specialist at any time during the year following the death of a loved one. We have also established our own reference center that provides adults and children with books and magazines that deal with death and bereavement.

GIVING BEREAVED CHILDREN THE ATTENTION THEY NEED

The Bessette family offers an exclusive bereavement support program especially for bereaved children ages 6 to 12.

Developed by support and bereavement specialists Sylvie Bessette and Claire Foch, the *J'écoute ma toute petite voix* (My little voice) approach offers bereaved children and the adults supporting them, the tools and resources they will need to work their way through their grief.
